## Breaking the Silos: Empowered Adolescent Girls and Young Women Accessing Integrated Services

An OAFLA side event was organised on o8 June 2016 in collaboration with UNAIDS, GAVI Alliance and PEPFAR, in the margins of the High level meeting on AIDS held in New York. First Ladies from Africa were joined by the First Lady of Haiti and the First Lady of Panama in calling for the empowerment of young women and adolescent girls in the HIV response.

They urged providers of health care services to better integrate service delivery and programme design to support the empowerment of adolescent girls and young women to make informed life choices and keep themselves healthy, including protecting themselves from HIV infection.

## DECLARATION OF COMMITEMENT OF AFRICAN FIRST LADIES MEMBERS OF OAFLA ON BREAKING THE SILOS:

## EMPOWERING ADOLESCENT GIRLS AND YOUNG WOMEN TO ACCESS INTE-GRATED SERVICES

We, the First Ladies of Africa, members of the Organization of African First Ladies Against HIV/AIDS (OAFLA) working towards our vision of **"An Africa free from HIV and AIDS, maternal and child mor-tality where women and children are empowered to enjoy equal opportunities**";

**Reaffirming Our Commitment** to the "Call to Action for Routine Immunisation for Every Child" as part of our Strategic Plan 2014 - 2018.

**Highly Committed** to the implementation of the SDGs and the Political Declaration on HIV/AIDS which will be agreed upon at the High-Level Meeting on HIV/AIDS in New York on 10th June 2016.

Acknowledge the renewed leadership and commitment of United Nations Member States, community members including organisations of women living with HIV, and partners in ensuring we fast track the response to HIV, leaving no one behind, over the next five years to achieve our set targets.

**Remain Concerned** about the continued lack of engagement of adolescent girls and young women.

**Recognize** that without programmes addressing the specific vulnerabilities of adolescent girls and young women, millions of girls will continue to be trapped in a cycle of poverty and inequality.

### We, therefore, reaffirm and expand our commitment:

- To continue to advocate for gender equality and the empowerment of adolescent girls and young women ensuring we end all gender-based violence.
- To support intersectoral, multilevel, and multicomponent actions to ensure all adolescent and young people's health and wellbeing.
- To champion communities access to an integrated package of preventive and curative services that address the needs of adolescent girls, including immunisation, nutrition, sexual and re productive health and rights, education and livelihood generation.
- To advocate for increasing domestic investment for adolescents and youth ensuring sexual and reproductive health services free from discrimination and comprehensive sexuality education, including gender equality, is accessible to all youth.
- To ensure adolescent girls and young women particularly and youth overall are engaged and empowered to be part of the change and accountability mechanisms, such as All In and other youth-led platforms.

We the First Ladies of Africa, together with First Ladies from Latin America and Asia Pacific will work with and for adolescent girls and young women to provide opportunities for equal rights in order to realize their full potential; creating a safe and prosperous environment for their wellbeing and good health. Together we will achieve the end of the AIDS epidemic in 2030, and realize the promise of the SDG Agenda.

# Mother and Child Social Entrepreneurship Luncheon

General Electric (GE) in partnership with the Miller Center for Social Entrepreneurship invited OAFLA members to the launch of a social entrepreneurship program across Africa designed to help existing entrepreneurs develop innovations to improve the lives of African mothers and babies. The event was held in the margins of the 2016 HLM at the Waldorf Astoria New York hotel.



On the occasion GE and the Miller Center expressed their interest to partner with OAFLA on the program. First Ladies of Namibia, Niger, Cote d'Ivoire and the Minister of Basic Education of Gambia attended the event. The First Ladies present at the event indicated that the program will benefit Africa by bringing innovative approaches to improve maternal and child health. The partnership request by GE was considered positively and the mandate to pursue this further was given to the OAFLA secretariat. Hence the OAFLA Secretariat and the GE team will work together to present a concept note on the partnership at the 18th OAFLA GA in January 2017.



## **African Vaccination Week**

OAFLA members have adopted a call to action on "Routine Immunization: Reach Every Child". In line with the Call for Action GAVI has provided a tool kit for First Ladies which provided member states with ideas and activities for African Vaccination Week (April 24 – 30, 2016) as well as other suggestions for immunisation advocacy and engagement throughout the year.

The tool kit as well the social media package for the African Vaccination week were sent to member states as well as to WHO country offices which coordinated the implementation of activities during the said week

# AUC Chairperson and Ethiopian First Lady discuss upcoming Cervical, Breast Cancer Conference

She equally highlighted the challenges and the critical importance of holding such a conference in Addis Ababa, during the Year of Human Rights with a particular focus on women's right. The First Lady noted the advanced stage of preparations of the conference and invited Dr. Dlamini Zuma to grace the conference with a keynote address during the opening.

The Chairperson of the Commission expressed delight for the AU to hosting such a conference of critical importance. She welcomed the First Lady's initiatives and congratulated her for championing the cause, which she described as extremely noble.
